| Summative <br> Assessments | Assignments/activities completed at the end of the learning process; should require students to demonstrate mastery of standards being assessed in current unit | unit tests, essays, projects | 60\% | - will be accepted up to one week before midterm/final exam week - start at a grade of 70 if more than 3 days late |

## Test Re-take Policy

- Students must initiate the process.
- Students may not re-take a test if they have missing assignments.
- Students may earn up to and including a grade of $100 \%$ on test re-takes.
- The teacher should use the grade (original or retest) that best reflects the student's level of mastery of the defined learning objectives.
